### **About NOAA**

New Orleans Art Association is a non-profit 501 (c 3) organization open to adult artists and art lovers over the age of 18. Our goals are to promote art and to recognize artists in the community by exhibiting and publicizing their work throughout the New Orleans area.

The members of New Orleans Art Association find that meeting together for study, discussion and juried exhibitions of their work enhances their cultural growth and interaction.

The present New Orleans Art Association has held 23 national or international art exhibitions, continues the tradition of the Pirate's Alley Art Show, and coordinates yearly membership presentations.

# History

The Artists Association of New Orleans held its first art show in 1885, following in the footsteps of its predecessor, the Southern Art Union. The AANO incorporated in 1886, and in 1903 merged with the Arts Exhibition Club. The name was later changed to the Art Association of New Orleans (AANO).

By 1907, their annual exhibition attracted such artists as Claude Monet, Childe Hassam, Winslow Homer, Mary Cassatt, George Luks, and Robert Henri, all of whose works are now coveted by prominent museums and collectors.

The Art Association of New Orleans held 14 or more shows annually. Their 40<sup>th</sup> national exhibit was presented in 1941.

Local businessman and philanthropist Isaac Delgado donated funds to create an art museum, to be supervised by the AANO. The Delgado Museum opened in 1911, was incorporated in 1958, and merged with the art association in December of 1959. The museum changed its name to the New Orleans Museum of Art in 1972.

A splinter artist group known as the "Art Association Guild" was founded on August 15, 1952, to support the work of its parent group, the Art Association of New Orleans. On March 11, 1970, the Guild adopted the current name of The New Orleans Art Association.
